




Geography Books to Enrich the Curriculum


Year 6- North America


Year 5-Europe


Did you know that Spain's La Tomatina festival, where 110 tons of tomatoes are thrown every year, is the world's biggest food fight?

Year 4-Contrasting Locality





Year 3- Changing Newton





Year 2- Newton in Merseyside




