### PARENT GOVERNOR VACANCY

#### Parent Governor Vacancy

Due to the resignation of one of our parent governors we now have a vacancy on our governing board.

You will be expected to attend at least two meetings of the governing board each term, these are held on various days at 4.30pm. We also hold termly governing board development sessions starting at 5.30pm. Meetings usually run for two hours.

Every governor is also linked to at least one of the subjects that the children study. You will be expected to meet twice a year with the teacher leading that subject to learn how it is taught and assessed in our school and then write a brief report of your visit for our records.

An extensive programme of governor training is offered by St Helens Council in addition to the on-line training available through the National Governance Association. All new governors must undertake safeguarding training and complete the indution training within twelve months of their appointment.

Please consider this important role and put your name forward if you believe you have the time and skills to support the work of the governing board. We would particularly welcome nominations from parents with experience of working in education.

#### Being a Parent Governor

The role of a parent governor is no different to that of the other school governors. They hold equal rights and status, and your involvement is not limited to matters of parental interest. Instead, parent governors hold the unique position of being able to share a parental perspective into strategic discussions and decision making.

Through your children you will have first-hand experience of the daily life at St Peter's, what they think of the school from their point of <u>view</u> and you'll have experience of the curriculum we teach.

#### Parent governors are:

- Well placed to understand parent's views and to remind the governing board how matters being discussed affect parents
- Individuals who act according to their own conscience. How they vote on any decision is up to them

- In a good position to help the governing board to communicate effectively with parents
- · Equal in all status to all other governors

#### Parent governors are not:

- Expected to gather the views of other parents and take them to the governing board.
- · Simply expected to represent the interests of parents
- Expected to vote as instructed by other parents

#### How to fulfil your role

Being a parent governor involves achieving a delicate balance of roles; from sharing your experience as a parent to helping the governing board with the strategic management of the school. Some of the things you can do to help you in your role are:

- Learn all you can about the <u>school</u>; its policies, procedures, the curriculum, its teachers
- Give your time to prepare for and attend governing board meetings regularly and play an active role in committees and decision making.
- Regularly undertake governor training to ensure you understand your role and responsibilities and can effectively support the governing board.
- Arrange visits to school to see how the curriculum is being taught by teachers.
- Always represent the school positively

As a governor you are one of a group, which means you can have your say on decisions in meetings and vote in the way you wish; but support the outcomes of votes – even if you disagree.

The role will also give you access to a lot of highly sensitive and confidential information – it's important you always observe confidentiality and don't discuss it with anyone who is not a governor.

#### How you can help parents

Parent governors are likely to have more visibility to other parents, from the daily school run, than other governors and there are ways you can help parents in your role.

- Be approachable to other parents, but make sure you are clear about your role.
- Consider how the school communicates with parents and how easy it is for parents to go into school to discuss things with the headteacher or teachers
- Consider how accessible the governors are and if parents ever get the
  opportunity to meet with governors; do they know how to get in touch with the
  chair of governors if they need to.

From time-to-time parent governors may be approached by other parents asking for help or wanting to make a complaint about something the school is or isn't doing. Direct parents to the school's Senior Leadership team who can help with most queries and concerns and it's important not to raise expectations of being able to fix any issues – a governors' role is to help the board make informed decisions that balance all sides of every story.

Mr Kevin Smith recently joined the board and has written about his experience as a new governor.

When I was first asked to become Foundation a governor, I realised that although I was interested in the role, I wasn't too sure what it really involved other than knowing there were regular meetings to discuss what happens in the school. I learned more about what the governor role entails and found the National Governonce Association website helpful for this. Once I knew more, I was still interested, and thought that my professional experience could be useful in the role. I agreed to being nominated by St Peter's Church as a governor and was appointed to the governina board in June 2022.

It has been interesting learning so much more about the school our child attends and it feels fulfilling to be in a position to help support the school community. As you might expect, the role does involve a time commitment. I have learnt much more about the role and what I am required to do, completed a range of training courses, and regularly prepare for and attend different board and committee meetings. The full governor board typically meet once a term for a couple of hours, as does each individual committee. There are also ad hor meetings that take place for a variety of reasons, for example we recently met with teachers to understand how they have weaved the main subject concepts into the COURAGE curriculum.

I've really enjoyed my time as a governor so far and would recommend that anyone who is interested in the role finds out more about it and considers applying. I've been able to see just how much hard work and effort goes into the running of the school behind the scenes to make it a safe and engaging place for the children to learn, and it feels rewarding to have a role in supporting this. I find it a really positive apportunity to contribute to the school and its longer-term development, helping to ensure that children across all year groups can achieve their full potential from their time at \$1 Feter's.

#### Our Early Help approach

If you feel your child could benefit from some pastoral support, do not hesitate to contact us.

Our Senior Mental Health Lead ensures that all our pupils who require pastoral care for issues such as bereavement, friendship issues, home issues and anxiety, receive time each week with our pastoral staff who offer over 8 hours of individual and small group sessions.

If you feel that your child could benefit from this offer, please contact Mrs Colley.

The team has regular meeting to discuss and measure the progress of pupils who fall into specific categories, including attendance, wellbeing issues, SEN, behavioural issues and safeguarding.

### MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

Please could we ask that you let the school office know in advance if your child has a medical appointment.

Could we also ask that you provide the office with a paper copy or phone screen shot of the appointment and inform us what time you will be collecting/dropping off your child on the day of appointment.

# **Holiday Requests**

Please note that all term time holiday requests will be unauthorised. Taking holidays during term time does have a detrimental effect on a child's education. Extended holidays in particular can be the difference between children achieving their year group objectives and not particularly if the pupil then is off for period of time with a sickness. Any pupil that falls below 94% attendance is classed as a cause for concern and will be contacted by the Education welfare Officer.

There are penalties, as set out by St Helens MBC, that could lead to up to £600 for a family of four Penalty notices - St Helens Borough Council

#### **ABSENCE**

When reporting on the absence line, can we politely request that you leave a brief description of your child's illness rather than just saying they are unwell. If your child has vomiting or diarrhoea please note that they should not return to school for a period of 48 hours after the last incident. This is a local authority policy

Applications for Holiday Leave must be submitted to school at **least 4 week**s in advance. Forms can be found on the school website or requested from the school office. In accordance with Government and Local Authority policy, holidays taken during term time will only be authorised in **exceptional circumstances**.

It is very important that if you change contact numbers, emails or addresses that you advise us as soon as possible. Any changes must be sent into school via email.
