MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD TEACHER

Dear Parent / Carer

This week was obviously dominated by the weather. Well done to everyone who managed to get in, it was touch and go for a few staff, but we all made it. The children had a lovely time playing in the snow, and it was even a great opportunity for Reception Class to use it in their topic on seasons.

The Environment Hub was finished this week with its internal cladding and insulation now complete. The ranch fencing has been put up and so it is now time to start furnishing the Hub itself and getting the wildlife area ready for the growing season. It will take time for the garden to become established, however we have already started to use it with Reception using the Hub yesterday to do some investigation work. Some classes have signed up for the RSPB Big Schools Birdwatch 2024 and the Woodland Trust and Mersey Forest have been along to see what trees we can have planted.

Some of you may have seen in the local and regional press that St Peter's is the third most oversubscribed school in Merseyside. On Friday 2nd February 2024 we are supporting the charity NSPCC and asking children to come to school 'dressed up as digits'.

As part of our commitment to make maths exciting and high profile in our school, we are taking part in a friendly competition involving schools in the United Kingdom for NSPCC Number Day.

The competition runs from **07:30 to 19:30 GMT on Friday 2nd February**. It's all done online via play.**ttrockstars**.com. Years 3 to 6 will take part.

Children can play in any game mode with every correct answer to a multiplication or division question, earning themselves, their class and the school a point. The Times Tables Rock Stars platform will calculate the class average (the number of correct answers per pupil in the class who play during the competition hours, subject to a 60-minute limit (see below)).

Winning classes in the school and in the competition as a whole will be the ones with the highest average.

To support player well-being, there is a daily time limit of 60 minutes per player. Once the player goes beyond 60 minutes of play on that day, they will still earn coins but will no longer earn points towards the competition.

In the spirit of the competition, please don't play on their behalf but by all means, encourage and support them to the extent that it doesn't cause high stress levels or impact on family plans.

MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

Holiday Requests

Please note that all term time holiday requests will be unauthorised. Taking holidays during term time does have a detrimental effect on a child's education. Extended holidays in particular can be the difference between children achieving their year group objectives and not particularly if the pupil then is off for period of time with a sickness. Any pupil that falls below 94% attendance is classed as a cause for concern and will be contacted by the Education welfare Officer.

There are penalties, as set out by St Helens MBC, that could lead to up to £600 for a family of four Penalty notices - St Helens Borough Council

ABSENCE

When reporting on the absence line, can we politely request that you leave a brief description of your child's illness rather than just saying they are unwell. If your child has vomiting or diarrhoea please note that they should not return to school for a period of 48 hours after the last incident. This is a local authority policy

Applications for Holiday Leave must be submitted to school at **least 4 week**s in advance. Forms can be found on the school website or requested from the school office. In accordance with Government and Local Authority policy, holidays taken during term time will only be authorised in **exceptional circumstances**.

CHANGES

It is very important that if you change contact numbers, emails or addresses that you advise us as soon as possible. Any changes must be sent into school via email.
