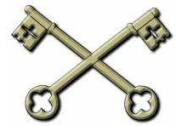

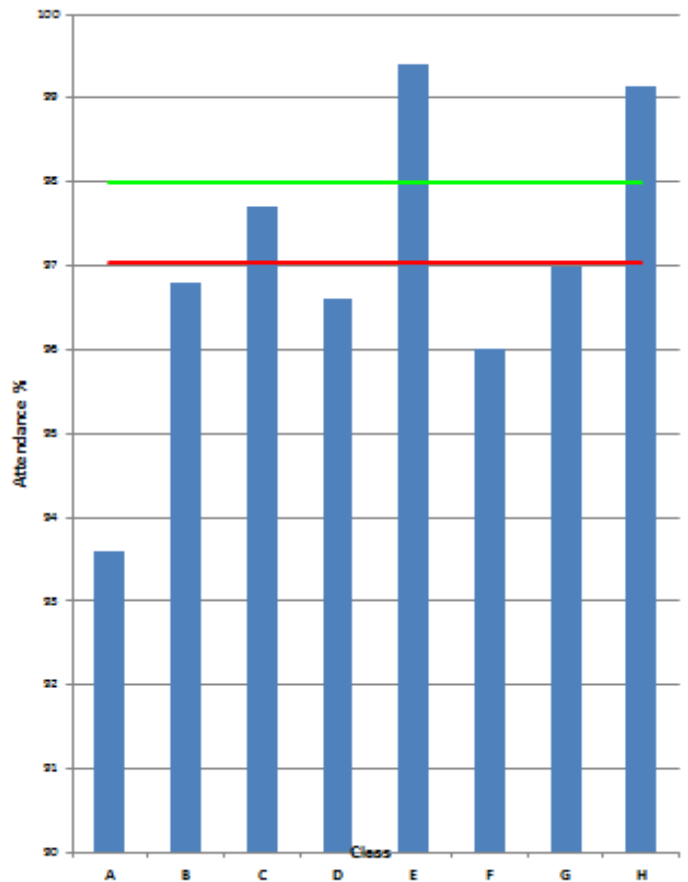

Just in case you missed it, we have started a reading challenge to encourage children to read much more both in and out of school. The challenge is for all children to read at least 4 times per week. They can read any book as long as it is for at least 10 minutes per session. You then fill in their reading record and if we see four signature for the week their name will go into a prize draw for a brand new book. One child from each class will win a book every two weeks.
