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Dear Parents/Carers

Doesn't time fly fast? It only seems a short while since I took up the post of your new Head teacher at St Peter's. It has been an honour and a privilege to get to know the children and their families. I have been made to feel very welcome and the smiles and warm greetings from the pupils every morning makes everything I do feel worthwhile.

It has been an incredibly busy year, with many successes, and these would not have been possible without a devoted team that are the foundation of this school. I would like to thank the Governors for their unwavering support, the immense staff who have worked so hard and at times past the call of duty to carry out much needed changes, the volunteers that come in to help and finally the PTA, who are the epitome of all that's great about the community feel in this school.

Looking back, so much has changed. Externally, you will have seen things like a closer collaboration and openness with parents, more playtime equipment, after school clubs, entering school competitions ... and winning them! The bike rack never materialised, but I am still working on that! Behind the scenes, there have been many more changes to ensure that the four year decline in academic achievements were reversed. Although I will only be releasing data in the new academic year, I can tell you that St Peter's is getting back to where it belongs with fantastic results in Key Stage 2 this year.

Next year, we will be concentrating on a new whole school curriculum, the infants and EYFS will be working differently, with no split classes for a minimum of 80% of the time and improving children's outcomes across the school with a particular focus on reading and home/school links. On the pastoral side, we will be looking more at growth mind-set work by teaching children to become more resilient in day to day life. I am also pleased to announce that I'm putting together a, 'Pastoral Care Team' who will be working with children who are struggling in areas such as building relationships, are having emotional difficulties and/or dealing with daily struggles that we can help with. We will also be hoping to introduce a new phone App that gives you real time news and photos of what your child's class is doing.

At this time of year, we celebrate success, however this is tinged with a hint of sadness as we say goodbye to our Year 6 children. Although I have only known them for a year, I have grown very fond of them and they have been a credit to the school. I'm sure he will have a great time in his new role in Bangkok.
