# Message from St Peter's

Dear Parents & Carers,

I hope you had a lovely time off with your children over the school holidays, the weather wasn't great, but after a long first half term, the pupils were ready for a break. The coming term brings us plenty of activities and festivities as we work our way up to Christmas. The school and PTA have a number of things planned that will hopefully fill them with joys of what is a special time. However, Christmas isn't until next month and the hard work resumes as we continue with our work in class, Covid-19 catch up classes, mental wellbeing provision for pupils, nurture groups, extracurricular activities and coming soon, reporting to parents.

Well done to Year 6 last term who won the afternoon at the movies experience. This is when classes are given a red or yellow counter for how they conduct themselves around school. The class receives a yellow counter for amongst other things perfect lining up when the bell goes, walking through school quietly and sensibly, notably excellent behaviour on the playground and the way they talk to lunchtime staff. A yellow counter is only awarded by any member of staff if it is above and beyond. A red counter is awarded if the class as a whole, or one member of the class falls below the expected standard. The yellow counters are added up, take the amount of reds away from the total and we get a final total. The children were fully involved in coming up with this idea and have really got on board with it. It also ensures they work as a team as a class and they encourage each other to go for the yellow counter.

The results of our parent survey is now on our website for you to look at. One of the things I noted was that parents wanted to know more about what their children were being taught in class. I will look into how we can get this across to you more clearly, however in the meantime if you look at your class webpage, this should have lots of information on it. Also, if you are interested in specific subjects if you click on **Key Information** then **Curriculum**, there is a comprehensive guide to every subject with its own webpage, policies, curriculum over views, some have knowledge maps, subject vocabulary and examples of work. Take a look to see what our curriculum looks like. Some examples are detailed on the following page.

When reporting on the absence line, can we politely request that you leave a brief description of your child's illness rather than just saying they are unwell. If your child has vomiting or diarrhoea please note that they should not return to school for a period of 48 hours after the last incident. This is a local authority policy

Applications for Holiday Leave must be submitted to school at **least 4 weeks** in advance. Forms can be found on the school website or requested from the school office. In accordance with Government and Local Authority policy, holidays taken during term time will only be authorised in **exceptional circumstances.**
