Message from St Peter's

Dear Parent / Carer,

At lunch we had our special Christmas Dinner with all the staff in attendance, making sure that everyone ate their sprouts...apart from me! Thanks to Mrs Dearden and her team for their amazing efforts.

I set a task this week for every child to go home and tell you about the Learning Pit in their classrooms. If like me, you get a 'nothing' when asked what your children have done in school, then it's worth asking them about the learning pit.

Every class has a learning pit, and it is based around growth mindset, resilience and having a never give up attitude. Around school we have many inspiration quotes painted onto the walls and most are about growth mindset.

A learning pit is a tool that clarifies to the pupils that in order to experience deep learning, it will be difficult, and it is okay to struggle. It is a picture that gives our children a visual of how learning happens. They will learn that it is okay to fail, struggle, and have to work at a new skill before fully understanding and succeeding. If a child answers a question immediately, then they have jumped over the pit and have not been challenged.

The Learning Pit refers to the idea that when you learn a new concept or skill, you experience a feeling of being stuck, a hard struggle, almost like there is a wall to climb over in order to begin to understand something. When you are learning something new, it can be difficult for your brain to grasp until you practice enough or until you try again to come to complete the new skill. The learning pit just explains the reality that when you learn something new, you may make a mistake, you may fail, and it may be difficult, but it doesn't mean you can't learn it.



We have many growth mindset and resilience messages around school.

All our children can point to the learning pit in class and when I ask them during a lesson, they can often tell me if they are falling, at the bottom, climbing out of or at the top.

In accordance with Government and Local Authority policy, holidays taken during term time will only be authorised in **exceptional circumstances.**
