Dear Parent / Carer,

Thank you for attending parents evening this week. It was a pleasure to finally see you all in school once again. It has again been busy, with Road Safety visiting Year 5 to give them some hints on how to walk and cycle to school on their own safely. Reception had a wonderful visit from a travelling seashore and children could learn about and handle crabs, sea urchins and starfish. Year 5 also visited a St John's Church to learn about the Easter Story and finally today, we have had the Dogs Trust in to visit Key Stage 2 and learn about being safe around dogs. Never a dull moment!

We have had some parents ask about the Ukraine Appeal. I have been in touch with SWUSH 'Stand with Ukraine St Helens'. After half term, we will be undertaking an appeal for Ukraine, however it is vital that we ask for items that are needed, so with their consultation, I will put together a list and we can do a week-long event of bringing in essential items and we will also be selling yellow and blue ribbons.

<u>Covid</u>: Obviously, there are now some rules changes with regards to testing for Covid. It isn't particularly clear for schools at present; however, it does seem that testing is becoming more difficult from April 1st, and you will be charged for testing kits. Any child who does display symptoms when we return **must** still stay off school and isolate for a minimum of five days, however I will have more detail after half term. Please have in mind that over 40% of our pupils have tested positive since November, so this has not gone away.

Can I just say a very Big Thank You to everyone who bought a ticket for our Easter Raffle your support has been overwhelming. Good luck to you all.

Don't forget that we are finishing today (Thursday) and that we return on Tuesday 19th April.

School Uniform Reminder

A polite reminder about our school uniform policy:

- •No jewellery can be worn apart from a normal watch.(If you want your child's ear pierced, this should happen at the start of the school summer holiday) we will allow clear plastic earring retainers to help pupils on return to school if required.
- No SMART watches
- Appropriate school shoes should be worn, not boots or black trainers.
- No hoodies in place of a school jumper/cardigan unless on a PE day.
- •PE Kit: Pupils should come in their normal PE Kits (plain white T -shirt, navy shorts and navy hoody) St Peter's branded PE Kit is optional. Pupils should <u>not</u> wear any branded clothing such as Football Club kit, Nike, Adidas, Hugo Boss and so on.
- Hair that reaches past shoulder length must be tied back.

After half term, pupils may wear their summer uniform.
