MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD TEACHER

Dear Parent/Carer

This week we had our Neon disco, thank you very much to the PTA who do all the organising for this event. The children had a great time, and they were very disappointed that it had to come to an end at 8pm which is a sure sign that they enjoyed themselves.

Some of you may have seen the recent publication about Parkside that was delivered to your doors last week. Can I first of all apologise that you had to open the page and see a picture of me with some quotes during the school holidays! I was asked to join the Parkside Forum by the developers because at the time I was the Head teacher of the nearest school and I have other links in the community. The idea is that the forum works with and challenges Parkside and local councillors about what they promised and how it affects the local community. I am informed what's planned, when and how it's going to happen. People's views are varied on Parkside, and I've told them mine. However, they like that, because I will bring up concerns that I and many others have about the issues of increased traffic, wildlife, air pollution, local job creation, impact on our school and so on. Please be assured that this is not a political role. I am, like you, part of the local community and as the Head teacher of one of the closest schools to Parkside, will act as a conduit between the community and the developers. I will also be informing all the other Newton and Winwick schools of any developments. So far, I've challenged them on interacting with local schools more and ensuring that our children are part of the development process for the ponds and tree planting that will take place when that stage arrives. If you have any concerns or complaints about the construction work that is going on, mud on the roads for example, you can let me know and I have a direct line to the person who will deal with it. I won't be getting involved in anything political or the planning process, that is for the Local Authority and council leaders to deal with. My time on this forum is also outside of school hours and in my own time.

AUTHOR VISIT – Sean Perkins



On Friday 11th November, children are invited to come into school wearing their own clothes accompanied with a jar of sweets which will go towards the St Peter's Church Christmas Fair



Holiday Requests

Please note that all term time holiday requests will be unauthorised. Taking holidays during term time does have a detrimental effect on a child's education. Extended holidays in particular can be the difference between children achieving their year group objectives and not particularly if the pupil then is off for period of time with a sickness. Any pupil that falls below 94% attendance is classed as a cause for concern and will be contacted by the Education welfare Officer.

There are penalties, as set out by St Helens MBC, that could lead to up to £600 for a family of four <u>Penalty notices - St Helens Borough Council</u>

ABSENCE

When reporting on the absence line, can we politely request that you leave a brief description of your child's illness rather than just saying they are unwell. If your child has vomiting or diarrhoea please note that they should not return to school for a period of 48 hours after the last incident. This is a local authority policy

Applications for Holiday Leave must be submitted to school at **least 4 weeks** in advance. Forms can be found on the school website or requested from the school office. In accordance with Government and Local Authority policy, holidays taken during term time will only be authorised in **exceptional circumstances**.
