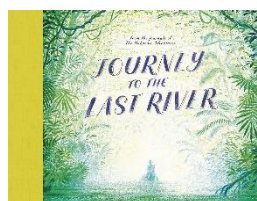




# Geography Books to Enrich the Curriculum

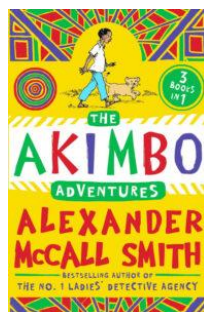
## Term 3

### Year 6- Rivers



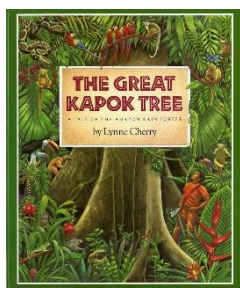

### Year 4-Rainforests



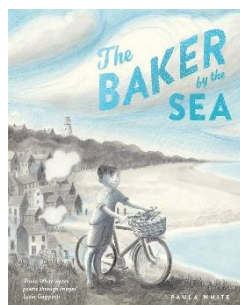

### Year 3- Our Earth



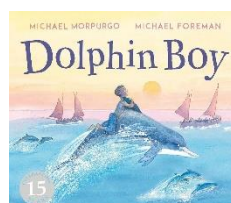

### Year 2- Coastal Locality



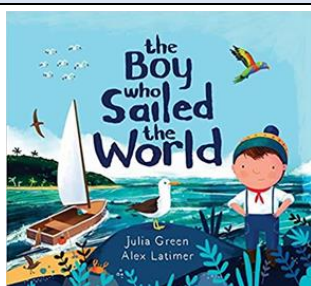
*If you keep walking over the hills and across the fields, you will come to the edge, where the land meets the sea. And on this edge lies a village. This is my home.*
